

Snack Time: 30 minutes


Tutors and students get together as a group to have a snack, catch up, and "unwind" from the day's events.

Tutoring Time: 60 minutes

Tutors and students work one-to-one in pairs. We help with homework and practice skills like reading, math and writing. We play educational games, too.



Club Time: 30 minutes
